A Vibrant and Transit-Friendly Community

The City of Edmonton is working on creating new places for people to be physically and socially active, while improving the transit-friendliness of our communities.

Planning for the North Central Community Recreation Centre is one aspect of this work. And, planning for the redevelopment of the larger area around the nearby Stadium LRT Station, known as the Stadium Station Transit Oriented Development Plan, is another.

Transit Oriented Development (TOD) is about integrating urban development with major transit centres and LRT stations, and transforming the areas around stations into higher-density, mixed-use, walkable communities. Connecting housing, shops, offices, and community amenities to one another, and to a central transit centre, makes it enjoyable and easy for people to get around by transit, walking, and biking.

The Stadium Station TOD Plan and the new North Central Recreation Centre project are complementary. The recreation centre will provide an important civic focus for this part of Edmonton.

It is anticipated that it will be a destination of choice for many people from across the city and will help increase LRT ridership.

The TOD Plan will provide a framework for transforming the entire area; people who visit, work and live there will experience a renewed, active, vibrant part of the city.

Design teams working on the Stadium Station TOD Plan and the North Central Community Recreation Centre, have been working together to ensure the recreation centre is integrated into the redevelopment of the station area.

The development of the Stadium Station TOD Plan is still in progress and the public is invited to review proposed land use and circulation concepts for the area at an upcoming community workshop.

FUTURE NORTH CENTRAL COMMUNITY RECREATION CENTRE



Commonwealth Sports and Fitness Centre will close to the public on September 1, 2009, to accommodate construction of the new recreation centre.

Commonwealth Stadium and Clarke Field will remain in operation during construction with minor adjustments to services. Bookings for Commonwealth Stadium and Clarke Field can be made by calling **311**.

For the duration of the closure, we encourage you to continue your recreation and fitness routine at a neighbouring City facility such as the Kinsmen Sports Centre, Londonderry Fitness and Leisure Centre, or O'Leary Fitness and Leisure Centre.

All Current Commonwealth Sports and Fitness Centre tier 2 and 3 passes will be honoured at other City facilities including the Kinsmen Sports Centre. Passholders also have the option of suspending annual passes during the closure, or receiving a pro-rated refund on passes.

The new recreation centre has a fresh design that will improve accessibility and integrate it with Commonwealth Stadium. The new recreation centre will include an aquatic area, fitness centre, fitness studio, gymnasium (existing), and indoor walking / jogging track.
