

2. ETS UPDATES

Retractable Bus Shield Installation

In mid-May, Transit Fleet Maintenance installed retractable bus shields on 4 ETS buses in order to determine installation requirements on the different bus models within the fleet. By the end of June the installation requirements and build the installation packages for each model will be confirmed. Transit Fleet Maintenance plans to begin installation of the retractable shields at a rate of approximately 30 shields per week starting in July.

After installation is complete on the 159 air conditioned buses, retractable shields will be installed across the remainder of the fleet, which will also be upgraded with air conditioning for the Operator's compartment. The anticipated completion date for retractable shield installation on the entire ETS fleet is April 2020. The project is being funded with a portion of the approved \$20 million funding for improved safety and security. This funding includes the 24/7 contracted security guards and the new Operator safety training courses.

Operator Recognition

Operator Chad Marak

Inspector Chuck Pearson

Inspector Chuck Pearson was awarded the Health & Safety Champion/Emergency Responder award at the 2019 Mayor and City Manager's Occupational Health & Safety (OHS) Awards. Chuck was recognized for his actions in February 2019 when responding quickly to an emergency situation while he was working as a relief inspector within LRT Operations. Since this event, an evaluation of procedures, training and engineering controls were conducted. A number of safety enhancements were made to eliminate the possibility of a recurrence.

Seasonal Shuttles to Edmonton Valley Zoo and Hawrelak Park

The new Route 596 will provide service between University Transit Centre and the Hawrelak Park entrance. Trips will run every 20 minutes from 9am - 9pm on weekends and holidays.

Route 594 is a seasonal route that travels between West Edmonton Mall Transit Centre (stop #5219- 175 St and 87 Ave Eastbound) and the Valley Zoo. Route 594 will run on weekends and holidays only from May 18 to June 30. Weekday service of Route 594 will start on July 1.

Regular ETS fares apply to both Route 596 and Route 594.

Transit Skills Roadeo

ETS representatives participated in the 2019 American Public Transportation Association (APTA) International Bus Roadeo from May 17 to 21 in Louisville, KY. The International Bus Roadeo is a learning opportunity for Operators to take part in seminars, engage with other transit agency professionals and compete in a bus operating skills competition. As part of the Bus and Paratransit Conference with APTA, there are multiple training sessions for operators, maintenance teams, and supervisors. ETS Operator Len Scherger, the winner of ETS' Transit Skills Roadeo, placed 33 out of 78 participants. Len placed the highest out of all other Canadian transit agencies competing in the international competition.

ETS Park & Ride Options

ETS is adding Football Park & Ride service from Eaux Claires Transit Centre and NAIT D Lot (109 Street and 118 Avenue) for the 2019 Edmonton Eskimos season, starting Sunday, May 26. Due to operational challenges and ongoing construction, bus service is cancelled from Burns City Lot and temporarily suspended from Kingsway Mall.

For every Eskimos home game, customers can board regular ETS buses or LRT for free using their game day ticket, which is valid for free travel up to two hours before, during and after the game. Football Park & Ride service begins 90 minutes before each game and operates until the stadium is deemed clear. Regular ETS fares apply for customers purchasing a game ticket at the stadium.

May Long Weekend LRT Outage

From May 18 - 20th, ETS shutdown the LRT service in the North East portion of the Capital Line (from Belvedere to Churchill) in order to allow construction to continue on the new road and pedestrian crossings being built just south of Stadium station. These crossings are a part of the new Muttart development taking place across the LRT tracks from Commonwealth Stadium. The construction work is driven by the developer, and led by PCL. ETS accommodated their work by shutting LRT Service for the long weekend. Work such as track realignment, signal cabling, concrete pouring, tie replacement is all a part of building these new crossings.

While the LRT Service was shutdown to accommodate the developer's project, ETS, Facilities Maintenance Services, Traffic Operations and other branches within IIS took advantage of the service outage opportunity to complete other maintenance and construction projects. Those projects included:
