Mandate

Healthy City is one of five strategic goals that City Council has identified as part of its Strategic Plan 2050. The goal aims to ensure that Edmonton is a city that thrives, where every member of our community has equitable opportunity to be healthy and fulfilled.

Active recreation, sport and leisure opportunities contribute significantly to the quality of life in Edmonton. Edmontonians value active, healthy lifestyles and want their municipal government to commit to both physical and mental health and wellness by providing active living opportunities that are readily accessible to all. This initiative allows Council to champion a healthy city by providing strategic direction and support for the four desired outcomes of this initiative.

Desired Outcomes

- Outcome #2: Health Increase the quality and quantity of active recreation opportunities available to Edmontonians, with a focus on children, to improve their health in a holistic way.
 - Increase the affordability of participation.

- Outcome #3: Community and Recreation Facility Master Plan and Park / Facility Optimization - The City of Edmonton will approach recreation from a holistic and sustainable perspective to address the broad continuum of community recreation needs required by citizens.
 - Edmontonians will have access to safe, welcoming places to:
 - Socialize
 - Be creative
 - Play, learn and develop physical literacy
 - Be active and exercise
 - Build community
 - Participate in and/or excel in their desired sport or recreation activity.
 - Community recreation facilities will:
 - Encourage and facilitate participation that will enhance personal growth, health and wellbeing
 - Foster a thriving sense of community connectedness, identity, spirit, engagement, and culture.
- Outcome #4: High Performance / Professional Sports Culture Edmonton retains existing and attracts new professional sports teams by creating an environment that supports teams/organizations while advancing the development of high performance athletes and programs.
 - Develop a collaborative strategy in partnership with key stakeholders that solidifies Edmonton as a leading community for professional sports and elite athlete development.
 - Develop strong partnerships and collaborations with key stakeholders including professional sport and sporting events.
