Jasper Place Transit Centre Improvements

WHAT WE HEARD

City of Edmonton

JASPER PLACE TRANSIT CENTRE

The City of Edmonton is revitalizing Jasper Place Transit Centre, a busy and well-used transportation node, to improve user experience and the comfort of operator facilities.

Revitalization of the transit centre will address security concerns and revitalize the current shelter.

Public feedback helped to inform the design of a newly improved transit centre and identified four key themes the public felt and said were important.

Moving the transit centre location was considered as part of the development plans for West Valley LRT, however proposed changes to the LRT alignment resulted in the decision to keep Jasper Place Transit Centre at the current location for the foreseeable future.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

POP-UP STYLE

Onsite at the Jasper Place Transit Centre

Saturday, June 10, 2017 (11am – 2pm) and Monday, June 12, 2017 (3:30 – 6:30pm)

Two public engagement sessions were held at Jasper Place Transit Centre to share the proposed design transit centre users and gather feedback from transit users. The sessions were held at varying times to reach peak and off-peak users. We interacted with 293 transit users.

WHAT WE DID

We gathered all the feedback from Jasper Place transit users, and based on the input we received, we refined the design with improvements to lighting and security. Amenities such as wifi, payphone and a clock will be included in the redesign. Transit user ideas and input directly influenced the emerging plaza space, to make it a more comfortable and welcoming environment.

We heard some excellent ideas which included adding drinking fountains, picnic tables, large washrooms and shade trees on the central platform. We were not able to include all these ideas due to space constraints as well as health and safety standards and bylaws. Some of these ideas received may be considered in the future if an opportunity arises.

Shelter Improvements



Seasonal temperature control, additional comfortable seating, drainage, cleaning, smoking area

Security and Lighting



Security cameras, security personnel, more lighting,

Public Amenities



Washrooms, phone charger, payphones, water fountain, clock, wifi

Construction Impacts



Duration, detours, stop locations, transfers

Landscaping



Trees, bike racks
