
ETS Branch Highlights Report

1. RIDERSHIP



ETS is pleased to announce that as of January 2023, weekly bus ridership has fully recovered to 2019 levels. This represents a substantial increase from December 2022 performance, where weekly bus ridership recovery averaged at 78% of 2019 levels. Since the week of January 8-21, bus boardings have averaged at 1,239,000 per week, peaking during the week of February 5-11 with over 1,297,000 weekly bus boardings. The week of February 5-11 represented a 16% growth over 2019 bus boardings while the week of February 12-18 represented a 7% growth over 2019 bus boardings.

Transit continues to enable mobility for thousands of riders each day. To support ridership growth and mode shift goals, major initiatives were implemented since the COVID-19 pandemic, including the Bus Network Redesign and On Demand Transit service in 2021, safety and security enhancements and the launch of the Arc electronic fare payment system in November 2022. The increase in ridership recovery over the past few weeks is also driven by the surge in downtown visitorship volumes. According to the Avison Young Vitality Index¹, weekly downtown visitor volumes in Edmonton have reached 142% of pre-pandemic levels. While there may be some fluctuations in ridership in the coming months, ridership patterns

will continue to be monitored and service improvements will be implemented to provide a more convenient and reliable service for transit riders.

2. ETS UPDATES

Bystander Awareness Campaign

The Bystander Awareness campaign will be launching in March 2023 to promote safe intervention by bystanders in transit spaces when they see an individual being targeted for inappropriate or threatening behaviour. The Bystander Awareness campaign emerged as one of the recommendations from the Safe City report in 2017 and builds on the experiences and perspectives of diverse intersectional transit riders. The initiative aims to educate bystanders and provide them with tools that empower them to make a positive impact on the safety of other riders.

School Open House Events

From mid-February until approximately mid-March, ETS is participating in junior and senior high school open house events. ETS representatives answer students and parents' questions about how to use ETS to get from home to school and back, as well as general questions about transit. For the first time this year, Transit Peace Officers are joining ETS representatives (when available) to answer questions about safety and security on transit. To date, 21 schools invited ETS to participate in their open house events.

ETS Special Events Service

<u>Silver Skate Festival</u>

ETS provided Special Events service for the Silver Skate Festival at Hawrelak Park on the weekends of February 11-12 and 18-20. Free shuttle service was offered from noon until 9:15 pm each day with shuttles running every 15 minutes to and from pick-up and drop-off locations at University Transit Centre, University of Alberta, and two bus stop locations on 87 Avenue. Estimated attendance at Silver Skate Festival was close to pre-pandemic levels with approximately 100,000 visitors over the 10- day period.

2023 JUNO Awards

The JUNO Awards are returning to Edmonton for the 52nd annual celebration of Canada's top musicians, singers, songwriters, producers and more. From March 10-13, several events will be taking place leading up to the awards. ETS will be activating Special Events service on March 11 for the JUNO Opening Night Awards at the Edmonton Convention Centre. Hotel shuttles will be provided to and from the Fairmont Hotel Macdonald, the Westin, Delta, and JW Marriott hotels.

2022-23 Annual Service Plan Launch

The 2022-2023 ETS Annual Service Plan will launch in April 2023, highlighting ETS' achievements in 2022, upcoming service improvements and projects being advanced to improve transit service for Edmontonians. The Annual Service Plan outlines some of the key service adjustments planned for 2023 in response to rider feedback, operational performance, and ridership patterns. These include adding more service hours and expanding On Demand Transit service approved as part of the 2023-2026 Council budget deliberations. Projects currently underway include, but are not limited to, implementing transit facility improvements; next phases of the Arc fare payment system; enhancements with partners on safety and security on transit; equity improvements, such as a reducing barriers to accessing low-income fare programs and LRT expansions.
