3.1 Chat about Elections and Accessibility	 City of Edmonton (CoE) updated the Bylaw to amend the legislation that was passed to ensure equitable voting for all Edmontonians Will be moving this to Council on June 10 C. Heywood and J. Nutbrown will be attending the June 9, 2025 meeting to discuss the changes in more detail. Also they are looking for feedback on ballot design, etc.
3.2 Council Advisor Updates	 All Committees of Council have Council members to act as liaison. Councillor Tang is the Accessibility Advisory Committee liaison. This relationship between Councils of Committees and Council has changed council decisions. D. Anatya-Moore spoke at Council on updates for C602a. Policy C602 draft actions. This is ongoing work for the CoE and AAC. CoE is looking at the Abilities at Work program which was a city program that employed adults with developmental disabilities for the CoE. Preliminary conversations with city admin are revisiting the program to see if it can be revitalized Treat Accessibility is seeking to have a proclamation at the event this year. Councillor Tang is working with the Mayor's Office.
3.2 Presentation - Sustainable Procurement	 Looking at ensure partnerships - will have good contacts/contracts with agencies Looking to make more products/services will improve the lives of a broader population. The CoE is putting a focus on accessibility with training. Ensure that accessibility is more front of mind Will pass on feedback to ensure Policy C602 to ensure there is a focus on accessibility throughout the procurement process: if accessibility can be used as a metric The CoE is still learning as they continue to make improvements to make the most impact

3.3 Presentation - Vehicle for Hire	 Feedback on the training was built in. There has been some push back with dispatchers, but there has also been some positive feedback. Would like to speak to individual drivers to get more detailed feedback An audit will be implemented later this year or early next year with dispatchers to see how the training is progressing. Then modifications can be made as required Would like to direct the public to make complaints through 311 as well as the company. Companies do not share complaints with the city. Unless a complaint has been made with the city, Administration cannot follow up with taxi companies to improve on issues. The City of Calgary's Council made a decision to reroute all the vehicle for hire complaints issues to the city. Edmonton will be watching what happens next. There are no refresher courses at the moment, but Vehicle for Hire will keep an eye on any potential issues Service dog refusals in vehicles for hire continue to be a big issue. Enforcement team is exploring changes to make stronger ramifications if they refuse a ride based on service animals
3.4 <u>Memo to Council Accessible Parking Inquiry from the</u> <u>Accessibility Advisory Committee (AAC)</u>	- In March, <u>members of the public</u> <u>came to an AAC meeting to discuss</u> <u>the issues with accessible parking</u> . The AAC wrote a letter to city administration to request that the city designate one accessible stall near businesses for wheelchair users only. This is not to create a hierarchy of disabilities
