Upcoming Transit Service Adjustments in the Belgravia and Windsor Park Neighbourhoods

Throughout the year, Edmonton Transit Service (ETS) monitors ridership levels and rider feedback to help adjust service levels and explore more efficient and effective ways to help riders get to their destinations. After a review of Route 726 servicing Belgravia and Windsor Park neighbourhoods, ETS has determined this route does not meet minimum performance standards due to low ridership.

As part of June 2025 service changes, ETS will replace conventional transit (Route 726) with On Demand Transit in the Belgravia and Windsor Park neighbourhoods. On Demand Transit will provide riders in these neighbourhoods with more hours of service, including service on Sundays, and greater flexibility compared to the current fixed 60-minute schedule.

On Demand Transit will operate within regular service hours for both neighbourhoods (Monday to Friday, 6am-10pm; Saturdays, 9am-7pm; and Sundays and holidays, 10am-6pm). Riders using On Demand Transit will have access to the University Transit Centre as their transit hub.

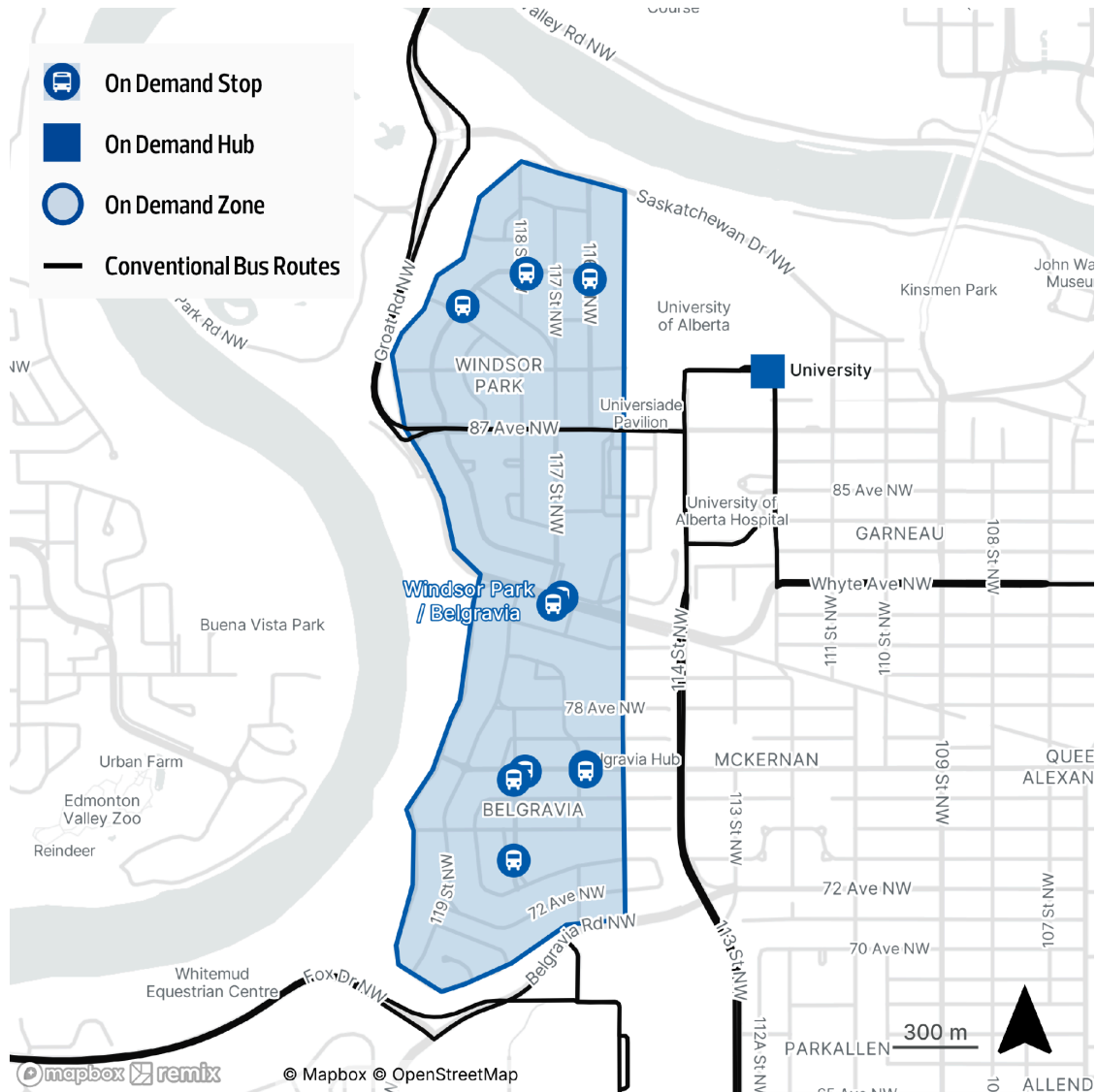

What is On Demand Transit

On Demand Transit takes riders from a set pick up/drop off spot in their neighbourhood to a designated transit hub. These buses are accessible for riders with limited mobility and include child-friendly seats.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will On Demand Transit have negative impacts on traffic volume in the neighbourhoods?

On Demand Transit vehicles typically wait at a transit hub (like University Transit Centre) during low demand periods.
