The City recently launched a new interactive dashboard to better track economic trends within our BIAs. Inquiry Appointments Available for Edmonton Service Centre

The Edmonton Service Centre in the Edmonton Tower is excited to support your projects through another busy construction season. If you are looking for information related to to projects which may require a Development, Building or Trade Permit, or a Business Licence, you can get in-person support from a team member through a prebooked appointment. Appointments offer an opportunity to speak directly to a subject matter expert at a specific time to provide support in advance of making a permit application. A building permit applicant is now required to submit a letter of confirmation, along with the application, for any facility delivering health care services. This <u>letter of confirmation</u> must show that the applicant:

- has reviewed applicable legislation
- is aware of relevant Alberta enactments
- understands that safety codes officers are not assessing or presuming the health services provided in a facility
- acknowledges that the owner, registered professionals, and constructor are responsible for ensuring the building design meets all legislative and regulatory requirements
- understands that a permit or permission to occupy a building or part of it shall not be construed to be a license to operate or engage in any business, and that other health care facility-related requirements may need to be met.

Application Processing Time Performance

As part of the City's commitment to streamlining services and supporting development and investment in Edmonton, we're providing more information on the development and building permit application processing timelines established in June 2022.
