The **draft Zoning Bylaw** (shared in September 2022) proposes reducing the number of residential zones in Edmonton by combining similar zones together, offering more housing opportunities and flexibility on properties. Get a glimpse of what Edmonton's future residential developments could look like by comparing **modelling examples** from the draft Zoning Bylaw's (RS) Small Scale Residential Zone with existing examples from the current **Zoning Bylaw 12800**.

#### **Outdoor Patio Program Now a Four-Year Term**

We have refreshed the program for 2023 and your business can now apply for a patio on a City sidewalk or curbside space! Exciting updates include an extended four year Licence of Occupation and the option for either a seasonal (April to October) or year-round (365 days) patio!
