

2022 Alberta Blue Cross® Usual and Customary (U&C) dental fees

The Alberta Blue Cross Usual and Customary dental fees are currently aligned with the Alberta Dental Association and College (ADA&C) provincial fee guide. The ADA&C has published their 2022 dental fee guide with a 4.4 per cent weighted increase when compared to the 2021 dental fee guide.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO GET THE MOST OUT OF YOUR BENEFITS WHEN YOU VISIT YOUR DENTIST?

The ADA&C publishes a provincial guide of standard fees for dental services in Alberta. However, this guide remains voluntary, so it is important to be as informed as possible before getting dental work done.

FIND A DENTIST

Our group plan members can make informed decisions by using Find a dentist to get the information they need. Find a dentist allows members to

- easily see whether a dentist's fees are below (\$), at (\$\$) or above (\$\$\$) the ADA&C fee guide;
- view the business contact information for each dentist;
- search for dentists by location or dentist's last name; and
- use a mobile device to get directions to a nearby dentist.

The Find a dentist tool can be accessed on the Alberta Blue Cross member site and app.

In addition to using our Find a dentist site, here are some additional things you can do to be the best dental consumer possible.

- Tell your dentist that your plan pays according to the 2022 ADA&C fee guide.
- Ask your dentist if they charge according to the 2022 ADA&C dental fee guide. This will give you an idea of whether or not your dentist is charging according to your plan's basis of payment.

- If your dentist doesn't, you can ask them how their fees compare to the fees contained in the ADA&C fee guide.
- The easiest way to know if you will have to pay out of pocket for dental services is to have your dental provider submit a predetermination to Alberta Blue Cross prior to your appointment. This allows you and your dental provider to check how much your plan pays for dental procedures you need before getting the treatment. Most predeterminations are processed instantly.
- Shop around. Because dentists charge differing fees, this can save you significantly.
- If you have another plan or a spending account, don't forget to use those.
