Key updates are as follows: A reminder about the upcoming tour of the Veterans Association Food Bank will be scheduled soon; A reminder that the April meeting is likely to be held downtown; a City Hall room has been secured for the in-person meeting. No lunch will be provided, but coffee/tea/water will be available. Following several members' request, it was proposed to move the April in-person meeting to 10 - 12.
		 Admin acknowledged that the last Edmonton Garrison Business Luncheon was a success and highlighted that it's a great opportunity to network. Admin would be happy to ensure all members get to go at least once during the year. MFRC Yellow Ribbon Gala update - We have 10 spots for the gala - Cut off for RSVP is April 14, 2023. Admin shared the results of her meeting with the Elks: They will be hosting a military appreciation game in June, looking to increase community outreach and involvement at these types of games; There is an interest in connecting with organizations that support/work with the military and have them come to the game with the intent of raising awareness of what they do; The game will likely involve a charity component - would like some ideas around organizations in need.
