
We are graciously asking for your support in our upcoming 6th annual signature fundraising gala, <u>A Dance to Remember</u>, taking place on November 4th, 2022 at the prestigious <u>JW Marriott</u> <u>Edmon ICE District</u>. The goal of this gala is to raise funds to help us continue and enhance our mission of honouring the sacrifice and service of Canada's military by educating students and placing poppies on the headstones of veterans across Canada and Poland every November. There are various ticket and sponsorship opportunities available, found <u>here</u>, that will place you front and center at one of Edmonton's most anticipated fundraising events.

We believe that our efforts and goals support the Edmonton Salutes mandate, as funds raised are put directly towards continuing to educate our youth and communities on the sacrifices of our past, present and future military services within Canada.

Purpose of Request:

Our 2022 goal is to have over 13,000 students having participated in placing poppies on over 70,000 veteran headstones, which can be shown in the graphic below. In order to achieve this, we have implemented various fundraising initiatives, such as the upcoming A Dance to Remember.

As November is quickly approaching, with the gala taking place on November 4th and Remembrance Day on November 11th, our timeline is quite short. In consideration of providing sponsorship to our upcoming gala, tickets and <u>sponsorship opportunities</u> are available to be purchase up until November 4th, with <u>general donations</u> being graciously accepted at any time. Please note that while the Presenting Sponsor opportunity has already been claimed, there are various other naming opportunities and sponsorships available. We are extremely grateful for the involvement of the Edmonton Salutes with NSLA over the past years, specifically your generous donation this time last year, and we look forward to continuing to build our relationship to continue to honour the efforts of the military in the past, present and future.
