C.2. Shoppers Drug Mart (DP) Chantelle Lowe- OT Architecture

The Committee supports the development, but encourages the Applicant to continue to work with Administration to consider the following recommendations:

- The proponent should reconsider the level of architectural facade development (e.g., spandrel glazing, sign boxes, etc) proposed along the north elevation and consider the reallocation of these enhancements into the visually exposed west elevation. (Principles A3 and C1). The architectural elevations do not reflect the proposed landscape plan. Based on the proposed landscape design, ten (10) 3m height Lodgepole Pines are proposed along the north facade. These plantings will screen the north facade.
- The proponent should consider enhanced architectural treatment and/or landscape/site component development on the northeast corner to increase landmark prominence of the 51 Avenue and Gateway Boulevard intersection (Principles A3 and C1).
- The proponent should consider landscape/site components to enhance key points of entry from 51 Avenue and Gateway Blvd. (Principles A3 and C1).
- The proponent should consider extending the sidewalk at the accessible parking to the west to provide improved pedestrian access to the crosswalk.
- The proponent should consider weather protection measures for seating areas (Principles B3).
- The proponent should consider revisiting the placement of bike racks, as to not limit pedestrian movement.
- The current design does not exemplify Principle B2 or Principle C1 with regard to supporting public art and responding to unique context. The applicant should consider integration of Edmonton-specific design elements and adoption of measures to improve user experience, such as enhanced landscaping and site furniture.
