We all play an important role in keeping our communities safe. Being observant and knowing your neighbors will help you recognize when something seems out of the ordinary. This could include things like an unkept property, suspicious activities like someone trying to open vehicle doors, a vehicle that appears abandoned, or graffiti.

HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP:

Get to know your neighbours and their vehicles to understand when a car or person is out of the ordinary.

Pay attention to your surroundings as you move through the neighbourhood;

- Note the little details like an open garage door or back gate.
- Let your neighbours know when their gate or garage door is open or if there is something that makes their property vulnerable.
- Be aware of potential hiding spots, recent vandalism, burned-out street lights or unsightly garbage.

Take action if you see anything unusual;

- Call **9-1-1** if it is an emergency where life, safety or property is in immediate danger or there is a crime in progress.
- Call the non-emergency line with concerns or information on a previous crime at **780-423-4567** or **#377** (on mobile devices).
- Some crimes can be reported online at www.edmontonpolice.ca or by using the **EPS Mobile App**.
- **Crime Stoppers**: Anonymously report crime and disorder tips at **1-800-222-8477** or online.
- For bylaw matters or public safety concerns like graffiti, burned-out street lights, and unsightly or unkempt properties, call City of Edmonton through **311** or use the App.
