	<ul> <li>Jack provided a brief review and update on Valley Line West project, and a high-level preview of information to be shared as part of the next major public engagement session to be held January 24, 2018 at St. Paul's Anglican Church.</li> <li>This next session will be a follow-up to the sessions held in November 2017, and will obtain additional public input to help inform Council as it decides on a number of possible amendments to the LRT concept plan in March. (The report with recommended concept plan amendments had previously been expected to go forward in December 2017.)</li> <li>The Council report will also likely contain a high-level look at a suggestion from the Stony Plain Road Business Improvement Area that Stony Plain Road west of 149 Street be converted to one-way westbound, with 100 Avenue to become one-way eastbound as a means of addressing road congestion.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Availability of funding is expected to be announced in the near future. Procurement will take some time, but construction could conceivably begin as early as 2019.</li> </ul>

It was noted that the City is building the "Abundant Community" initiative to help strengthen neighbourhood ties.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Councillor Knack shared some perspectives on transit in Edmonton, including the relative merits of LRT and BRT (Bus Rapid Transit), why anticipated ridership and capacity requirements alone favour LRT for the Valley Line West, and potential innovations to enable easy access to LRT for those not already within walking distance of the service.</li> </ul>
