Your new building has food scraps and recycling collection. You will find three separate containers located at every disposal location.

Please separate food scraps and recyclables from your garbage and place each in the correct container.




Getting started



Step 1


Check on your counter or under your sink for a food scraps pail. If the previous residents have taken it, you can use any container with a tight-fitting lid to hold your food scraps (like an ice cream pail).

You may line your pail with any type of paper or plastic bag to keep everything tidy. We remove the bag as part of the composting process.




Step 2

Find a place to store your recycling. A blue bag or old box will work great. You do not need to bag your recycling if you don't want to.



Step 3


Post your What Goes Where poster in a convenient location and refer to it when sorting your waste.



Step 4

Download the WasteWise app or use it online. WasteWise can help you sort items not listed on the What Goes Where poster. (See the back cover of this booklet)

Now you're ready to sort your waste!



Step 5

Throughout the week, empty your containers into the correct bin or cart in your building's waste room or disposal area. Put recycling in the blue bin. Put food scraps in the green bin or cart and close the lid.



Step 6

Regularly clean your food scraps pail to minimize odours. Use dish soap or vinegar, or put it in your dishwasher.




When food scraps are sent to a landfill, they produce methane, a powerful greenhouse gas. When they are separated from garbage, they can be turned into compost and energy, reducing emissions.

Single-family homes in Edmonton already sort their waste into food scraps, recycling and garbage. Between now and the end of 2027. people living in apartments and condos will begin doing the same.


