The freeway conversion includes the removal of the signalized intersections on Yellowhead

Road changes are being made on 128 Avenue to accommodate increased traffic expected when the signalized intersection at Yellowhead Trail and 149 Street is removed.

One lane of travel in the eastbound direction and two lanes of travel in the westbound

One lane of travel in each direction with a centre left turning lane (two-way left turn)
