Ex-Serviceman with pension \$60.00 monthly. Single. Living in 3 room cottage with sun porch, at present address 12 years, in City since 1905. Pays ground rent \$3.50 to City, and taxes. Comfortably furnished and spring water near by. Has garden. Living alone. Toilet outside. Location about one-half a block from boat house on north side of the lower road.

No electric light, but claims he is going to get it in next year.

House is cottage style, and kept very clean and neat.

Shack No. 2.

Telef in 1931 and 1932. Living in shack at Connors Road from 1932 till October 1936.

Owned shack, paying ground rent to City. Rent was in arrears and City took possession of shack.

Came to present location October 1936, purchased shack \$10.00. Furnishings - 2 chairs, cot & bedding, table, stove. No toilet, uses dump.

Shack in dirty condition.

Living alone. Water from Spring. Means of livelihood, gathers bottles and junk, gets a little work in Cafe, goes harvesting in Summer. Average earnings about \$20.00 per month. Does own cooking and laundry.

Shack No. 3.

At present on Single Men's Relief, and has been since 1932, Index No. T36, Group No. 70.

Has been getting bed tickets since September 17, 1936, to Miss. Mary Moranitsch, 9614 - 103 A. Avenue.

Came to City from Wetaskiwin, 1930, built shack and lived at present location ever since. Goes harvesting every Fall.

Has been living alone until a few days ago, when man named A jobbs, single, came in from Coal Mine and is now living with him.

Shack dimensions 10x14x6, cardboard inside, lined with tin on outside. 1 room. Furnishings - 2 chairs, 1 table, 1 bed and bedding, stove, and a few cooking utensils. Laundry and cooking done by himself. Water from boat house.

Toilet accommodation, uses dump. Condition of house inside, untidy and dirty.

Shack No. 4.

Men's Relief winter of 1935 and 1936. Camp 6. Worked on Railway in Summer of 1936, earned enough to keep him till work opens up in Summer. Came to Edmonton 1917, has been in and out periodically since.

Purchased shack for \$7.00 in November 1936. Living here since. Lined with cardboard inside and tin on the outside. 12x8x7.

Gets water from boathouse. Furnishings, 1 chair, 1 table, 1 stove, bed and sufficient bedding. House untidy. Living alone, one room. Toilet accommodation, uses dump.

Shack No. 46.

years. In Edmonton since 1932, steadily. On Single Relief 1932 & 1933, and periodically since. Living in tent in 1933. Sent by Salvation Army to look after furnace for Mr. Elliott on 112 Street Winter of 1933-34. Built shack Summer 1934, 12x10x7. Filthy, dirty, and smells bad. General lives with him, just in from Lumber Camp, and staying only a few weeks. Furnishings - bed and covering, table. Eats uptown, does no cooking. Means of livelihood - collects and sells cardboard boxes, also collects stamps. Makes \$3.00 to \$5.00 per week. Has toilet accommodation. No rent or taxes.

Shack No. 47.

L. 0, age 45 years, single. Came to Canada, Calgary, in 1926. Edmonton in and out since 1930. On and off Single Men's Relief since 1931. Index # 028. Not on relief at present. Came back to City at end of February 1937 with \$30.00. Built shack in 1933, 10x7x7. Covered inside with cardboard, and tin outside. Furnishings - side table, bed, oil barrel stove. Has C. radio. Getting City water from tap. Toilet - shelter and bucket, dumping into river. Does own cooking and laundry. Place very clean.

Shack No. 48.

Visited place several times and found it always locked. On enquiry, was informed that shack belongs to an old man (name unknown) who lately got his Old Age Pension, and that he was not seen there this week.

Shack No. 49.

Visited this shack several times, and each time found place locked. Could get no information as to who was the owner, or where he was.

Shack No. 50.

Visited place several times and each time shack was locked. Could get no information as to who was the owner or where he was.

Shack No. 51.

H. H. Ex-Serviceman, age 50 years, single. On Single Men's Relief off and on since 1930. On at present getting meals and bed tickets to Comfort Apartment. His Index No. H53. He is not living in shack, but coming over off and on and sees that nothing is taken away. Owner of the shack is out in Relief camp. His name is unknown. However, are informed that while owner is in his shack, he gets his water out of City water tap. Toilet outside. Shack filthy.

Shack No. 52.

E. L. Swede, age 61 years. In Canada since 1906. Single. In Edmonton since 1918. Part time work on railway. On Single Men's Relief since 1934. Steadily in City. Relief No. L25. Purchased shack in 1933 for \$5.00, 6x10x7. Cardboard inside, boards and tin outside. Carpet on floor. Toilet accommodation. Furnishings - stove, bench, bed and bedding. Everything Clean.

Shack No. 53.

A Good, Scotch, age 58 years, single. In Canada 30 years. In and out of Edmonton since 1922, working on farms in Summer, and in City in Winter. On Single Men's Relief 1930 and 1931.

Bought shack 1934 for \$5.00. Harvesting 1935 and 6 weeks in 1936. Gets odd jobs. Now lives principally on money he makes in Summer. Furnishings - stove, bench, bed and bedding, does own cooking and laundry. Everything in shack is clean and tidy. No rent or taxes.

Shack No. 54.

F. M. Canadian born, age 55 years, single. Has been homesteading with his father for years at Viking. Came to Edmonton June 1st, 1936, and on June 17th, went on Single Men's Relief. Has been on steady since, and is still on, getting meals only. Index # M334. Built the shack Fall of 1936. 9x8\frac{1}{2}x10. Cardboard lined inside, and tin outside. Furnishings - 1 homemade chair, table, bed, stove. Gets water from City tap. Toilet outside. Does own washing. Place fairly clean.

Shack No. 55.

E. Many, Canadian born, age 45 years, single, On relief in Calgary. Came to Edmonton Fall of 1934 and has been in and out since. Picking and selling junk since Winter of 1935. Makes from \$1.00 to \$4.00 per week. Never on relief in Edmonton.

Built the shack in 1934, 6x6. No chair, no table, bed made from cardboards. Has stove. Gets water from City Water tap. No toilet, using dump.

Does own cooking and laundry. This place is very small & very filthy.

Shack No. 56.

The above shack built by two boys, ages about 15 & 13 yrs.
L. Command B. Reme. They use it for a play house.

Shack No. 57.

R. F., Norwegian, age 27 years, single. Came to Canada in 1927. Edmonton 8 years in and out the City. Worked on anything he could find. Never on relief, and is not now. Has been at Errick camp. Came back to City lately with \$50.00 in his possession, and about 2 weeks ago bought the above shack. 12x8x7. Paid \$6.00. Getting water from City Water tap. Does own cooking & washing, also gets one meal a day up town. Furnishings - 3 chairs, table, bed, stove. Toilet outside. Place fairly clean.

Shack No. 5:

Age 42 years. Came to Canada 1917, Edmonton 1936. At present location since 1933, no rent or taxes.
Living in 2 room shack 14x6x7, alone, built from old lumber lined on inside with paper, outside with tin.
Residence in City since 1933 with exception of harvesting every Fall.
On Single Men's Relief Winter 1934 & 1935. Painting in Summer, Harvesting last Fall for a few days. Makes paper holders from willows, sells th odd one.
Principal source of livelihood is from painting.
Condition of house inside fairly clean. Furnishings, -2 chairs, 1 table, 1 stove, winnipeg couch with bedding, a few cooking utensils. Sanitary accommodation, uses neighbor's toilet. Water from boathouse. Does own laundry and cooking.

Earned \$42.00.
Furnishings, 3 chairs, 2 tables, 1 full-sized bed and
sufficient bedding, 1 stove, oven outside for baking
bread.
Condition of house inside, clean and tidy. Outside toilet,
does own cooking and laundry. Water from boathouse.

Shack No. 7:

Came to Canada 1922. Came to Edmonton from Lethbridge 1931, and was on Single Men's relief for a short period. During Winters worked a few hours daily for the Safeway Bakery, getting bread and cakes in payment, no cash. During Summers, goes harvesting, except in 1936 when he worked in City on gardens. Last Fall worked at Safeways and earned \$16.00. Sold his shack for \$12.00, sold some potatoes for \$8.00. Since last fall and up to present time, earned very little.

Built his 2 room shack lately. 1 room 10x8½, second room 9x8, each about 7 ft. high. Outside vovered with small pieces of tim. Inside fairly clean. Furnishings - 2 benches, table, stove, bed. Water from the boathouse, free of charge. Does his own cooking and laundry. Outside toilet.

No relatives in Canada.

Shack No. 8:

Winnipeg in 1911. Married, and has 2 children, Tony 21 years and E 18 years. Separated from his wife seven years ago, without any papers, just by mutual agreement. Wife and children are living in Drumheller at present. Wife alleged to be living with a man named F K Compared to Edmonton in 1932, built his shack out of boxes, 14x8x6. Covered outside with small pieces of tin. Shack consists of furnishings to extent of - 1 chair,

1 table, 1 stove, 1 bed. Place untidy. Getting water from boathouse, free of charge. Does own cooking and

laundry. Outside toilet.

Has been on relief until July 2nd, 1936. Out harvesting every Fall. Now selling junk, making \$3.00 to \$5.00 per month.

While inside the shack, I noticed a bottle on the table. I shook it and discovered it was moonshine. We admitted it was and had a drink in front of us. He also offered us a drink, which we refused. He states he got the moonshine from his friend on a farm.

Shack No. 9.

Mean, owner, Canadian, age 66 years. Single, living here since 1930. Purchased shack for \$7.00. Dimensions - 8xl0x7. Cardboard inside, tin outside. Furnishings - 2 chairs, table, 2 single beds & bedding, stove, a few cooking utensils, Water from boathouse. Sanitary accommodation - toilet with deep hole. Livelihood - employed by City as Fire Watchman at Dump, Salary \$5.35 per week. On relief in 1929 for two months. On City pay since October 1936.

Man lived with him named B Mean, who makes his living from sale of junk. Shack fairly clean. Does own cooking, and laundry is done by Chinaman.

Shack No. 9a. This shack is empty, and the name of owner cannot be discovered.

Shack No. 10. This place was locked up and occupant is at Camp.

Shacks Nos.

S. B. Age 38 years, came to Canada and direct to Edmonton in 1928, and has resided in the City ever since. Married in Edmonton in 1934, no children. Wife went to Vancouver 2 weeks ago for a holiday. Living at 9648 - 105A Avenue.

Bought the 11 & 17 shacks in 1936, paid \$6.00 each. Keeps

Bought the 11 & 17 shacks in 1936, paid \$6.00 each. Keeps junk in No. 11, and rents No. 17 to Messrs. See and Accept, for \$1.25 per month, who are making laundry baskets and selling them 65¢ to \$1.25 each. They are living at 10534 - 95 Street.

Because states that he makes his living by buying and

states that he makes his living by buying and selling different things and junk. Makes from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per month. Appeared to be very frightened while questioning proceeded.

Shack covered on inside with cardboard, outside tin and clay.

If I am not mistaken, I think we had him on MarriedRelief, although he denies being on relief anywhere.

(This case checked, and no record of him on Married Relief)

The Land, Irish, single, age 58 years. Came to Canada in 1912, and has been in and out of the City ever since that date. Never been on relief anywhere, and is not now. Makes files for invoices, and sells same, making from \$3.00 to \$5.00 per month.

Bought the shack in 1934 and paid \$7.00. 8x8x7, fairly clean, papered inside, with tin on outside. I small bench, table, homemade bed, stove, linoleum on floor. Water from spring. Does own cooking and laundry. Outside toilet.

Shack No. 12.

Shack No. 13.

R. To Went on Single Men's Relief on April 1st, 1937, as City charge. (Checked - spelled To No. 241, (meals only.)

Shack No. 14.

This shack is empty, and owner unknown.

Shack No. 15.

No children, wife dead. Came to Canada in 1912, not naturalized. Has been living in Vancouver and Calgary for a number of years. Came to Edmonton in 1925. Since then has been living in the City, during Winters, and in Summers out harvesting. In City steadily since Fall of 1935. Sells bottles and junk, making around \$5.00 per week. Never on relief anywhere.

Bought shack in 1933, paid \$10.00. 12x8x7, cardboard inside, tin outside. Furnishings - 1 chair, table, stove, single bed. Gets water from boathouse. Does own cooking, and laundry. Outside toilet.

Not paying ground rent or taxes. Shack very untidy.

Shack No. 16.

Could not locate man, but was informed by neighbors that he is on Single Men's Relief.

Shack No.17.

Post, & John Am (mentioned under Shack No. 11)
These two men occupy this shack which they rent from
S. Born - of Shack No. 11, on relief. They pay to
Born \$1.25 per month.
Shack not used for sleeping accommodation, but as a workshop for making baskets from willows, from the sale of
which they live. Furniture - stove & 2 seats.
In City 9 years. John on Single Relief 1932 to 1933,
Post on relief May 1936. Married, wife and two children
in Old Country, has given them no assistance since 1930.

Shack No. 18.

We Get and an aborn, single, age 30 years. In and out of Edmonton since 1934. In City steadily since end of October 1936. On Single Men's Relief in 1934, off part of 1935 and 1936. Went on relief again this morning. Index # Gll2. Getting meals only. Bought shack Fall of 1936. 10xl2. Covered inside by cardboard, and outside by tin. Furniture - 1 chair, 1 bench, table, bed, stove. Water from spring. Does own laundry. Toilet outside. Paid \$14.00 for shack.

Shack No. 19.

We visited the shack and found a man who appeared to be Scandinavian, age 30 yrs. This man refused to give us his name, or any other information. He states he came to City about 2 weeks ago, and with shack owner's permission, he uses the shack. Refused to disclose owner's name, although he said the owner was out in the country working.

However, he appeared to be in such a mood that if there had only been one of us instead of two, and he was pressed with questions, he would fly at the man's throat in no time.

We were informed that he is alleged to have a lot of money.

Shack No. 20.

Here, Swedish, age 50 years, single. Came to United States in 1912, and to Canada 1917. Came to Edmonton Fall of 1933, staying only a short period before going to Saskatchewan. Came back in 1934. Purchased shack on River Bank, sold it two weeks ago for \$10.00. Purchased present one two weeks ago for \$7.50.

10x8x7. Papered inside, tin outside.

Furnishings - 1 stove, 1 chair, 1 table, single bed & bedding. Shack and bedding dirty.

Living alone, 2 rooms. Man on relief. Livelihood, 1934 & 1935 selling artificial butterflies, making around \$5.00 per week. Since and up to present picking up rags & junk, making \$2.00 to \$3.00 per week. Water from spring. Does own cooking and laundry. No taxes or rent. Toilet outside.

Shack No. 21.

Canada in 1906. In and out of Edmonton since 1921.
In City steadily since 1929. Picking and selling junk.
Averages \$10.00 per month. Never on relief.
Built shack in 1930, 10x8x7. Furnishings - box for chair, table, homemade bed, stove. Outside of shack covered with tin, inside cardboard.
Water from a filling station, and sometimes from Market.
Does own cooking and laundry.
Toilet - shelter with bucket, burying when necessary.

Shack No. 22.

B. Now, age 69 years. Married in London, England, and does not know if his wife is still alive or not. Came to Canada 1907. In and out of Edmonton since 1910. On Single Men's Relief since 1930. On now. Index No. N9, getting meals only. Built shack in 1932, and inside covered with cardboard, outside with tin. 9x8x7. Furnishings - box for chair, box for table, homemade bed, and stove. Gets water from filling station, also by melting ice which falls off trucks while they are hauling ice to some ice storage. Toilet outside. On relief steadily for last two years.

Shack No. 23.

been on relief. In and out of City since 1919. Came to Edmonton from the tie camp Feb. 1, 1937.

Built the shack in 1935 out of pieces of wood, 8x7x6. Inside covered with cardboard and outside with tine. Place cold.

Furnishings - 1 homemade chair, side table, homemade bed, stove. Gets water from spring. Does own cooking and laundry. Toilet outside.

Shack No. 24.

Czecko-Slav. Wife & 1 child J 13 yrs. in Old Country. Came to Edmonton in 1928. Not naturalized. Not on relief since 1930. In City every Winter, but out Harvesting every Fall. Summer of 1936 in City sealing rags and junk, making \$5.00 to \$8.00 per month. Built shack with boxes, 10x8x8, in 1934. Outside tin, Furnishings- chair, table, bed, stove, linoleum on floor. Water from Spring near boathouse. Does own cooking & Laundry. Toilet outside. No relatives in Canada.

P. S., Hollander, age 65 yrs, single, naturalized, American. In B.C. from 1907 to 1911, in Alberta since. Built shack in 1933, 6x6x7. Furnishings - stove, chair, couch, few cooking utensils.

Employment, 1933 to 1934, washing gold. Summer of 1935-6 unemployed two months each Summer. With Mr. H., earned \$65.00 on which, with the sale of some junk and fancy jars that he makes, he has lived. Never been on relief.

Shack & furnishings clean and tidy. Linoleum on floor. Toilet outside. Pays no rent or taxes. In City steadily

Shack No. 26.

P. Legg, half-breed, single, age 29. Born in St. Paul. In City 2½ years. On Single Men's Relief sometime towards the end of 1934. In City steadily. Working here and there, earning from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per month. Has been living his his shack for the last two years, but this week was forced to move his shack to this location because the City started to dump the garbage on top of his shack. Present place is not finished, and there is nothing except stove, and the roof is full of holes. Has a Mrs. Mean and her boy Mean 13 years of age, living with him. Mr. Mean lives at St. Albert. She left him two years ago, and immediately went to live with Legg, who admitted this was so, and that he is supporting her and the boy, who is not yet going to school. Gets water at boathouse. No toilet. Mrs. Means also half-breed.

Shack No. 27.

J. H. Ex-Serviceman, age 47 years, single, getting \$15.00 per month pension. In and out of Edmonton 1929 until end of 1932. Steadily in City since 1932.

Built the shacks No. 39 & 40 in 1933. Now is moving himself from Nos. 39 & 40 to No. 27, because the City is dumping garbage on top of Nos. 39 & 40.

No. 27 is 12x10x7, and is not yet finished. Gets water from boathouse. No toilet yet. Does own cooking & laundry.

Furnishings, 2 chairs, table good bed, stove.

Sells junk and earns from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per month, plus his \$15.00 pension.

Shack No. 28.

Joseph Russian, age 45 years, single, not naturalized. On Single Relief steadily since 1930, meals only. Built shack in 1931 15x13x7. Lined inside with advertizements, outside with tin.

Furnishings - 5 chairs, bench, table, single bed & bedding, dirty.

Has about 100 pigeons, flying, and some in house outside, 2 dogs.

Earns no money. Gets water at Service Station on top of hill. Living alone. Has toilet accommodation. Relief Index No. K29.

Shack No. 29.

B. B. Austrian, single, age 44 years. Applied for naturalization, but was refused. In Canada 24 years, Edmonton 1914. In and out of City, harvesting in Falls. Homesteaded in 1929 to 1932 at Dip Creek, north of Athabasca. On Single relief latter part of 1932.

Shack No. 29. (cont'd.)

Built shack in 1935, living here since, with exception of harvest work. Earned harvesting in 1936 \$17.00, came back in Sept. and claims he has lived on that amount since, augmented by bread picked from the dump which he scrapes the dirt off and uses. Shack and everything in it is filthy. He looks like a mental case. Gets water uptown. Has toilet. Claims he was refused Single Relief.
Furnishings - table, stove, and homemade bed & bedding.

Shack No. 30.

In Edmonton since 1910. Married in Old Country, wife and 2 children, 1 son in Vancouver & 1 in Old Country, with wife.

Purchased shack 9x9x7 in 1934, living her since. Lined with papers inside, boards and tin outside. Linoleum on floor. Gets water at spring. Gets odd job sawing wood, etc., and makes enough to keep himself. Does no washing or cooking. Has toilet. Pays no rent or taxes.

Shack No. 31.

U. K. Russian, age 56 years, Ex-Sergiceman. In Canada since 1913. Living on Pension of \$22.50 per mo. Single.
Built shack in 1933. 2 rooms, 14x8x7. Living alone.
Does own cooking and laundry. Toilet accommodation.
Occasionally has meals uptown.
Has bed & covering, chair, stove & cooking utensils.
Fairly clean.

Shack No. 32.

There are two men living in this shack, but we could not catch them in it, as they are alleged to be selling the Communist papers daily uptown. The place was always locked.

Shack No. 33.

James, Canadian, age 58 years, single. In Edmonton since 1926. Came from Lethbridge where he lived since 1904, never on relief.
Worked periodically for Gas. Co. 1928, 29, & 30. At present location 18 months.
Built shack, has hole dug in ground where he has bed and stove, reached by ladder, with shelter built on top with cardboard nailed to rough boards. Bed and everything else is filthy.
Livelihood is gained by doing a little Kalsomining and selling junk. Previously living with man named Slywka on 111 A. Street. On relief. Gets water from Service Station. Uses neighbor's toilet.

Shack No. 34.

According to Good, half-breed, living with common-law wife, formerly Mrs. Good. 3 children, E 14, & E 10 belonging to Good. Many 3, belonging to Cook. According to C

l heater, 2 tables, 1 bench, 1 dresser, 1 gramophone, & cooking utensiès. On Direct Relief from Jan. 1934 to May 1934. Cut off and has not been on since.
Has lived in City past seven years, with exception of harvesting in Summer.
Family went to Calgary May 1935, he did threshing for Farmer, and earned enough to keep them. Came back in August.
Bought shack for \$10.00, and been living here ever since.
Livelihood, picks up junk, sells it, and claims he makes about \$10.00 per week. Pays no rent or taxes.
Gets water at Community tap. Has toilet.
Shack fairly clean.

Shack No. 35.

Regina. Farm laborer. B.C. in 1934, Calgary Summer 1935, Edmonton Nov. 1935.
Built shack March 1935. On Relief since that date, and at present, meals only.
Sold wood on market last Summer. Gets water at tap.
No toilet. Shack 8x10x7, inside lined with Cardboard, outside with tim.
Furnishings, stove, bed & clothing.
Everything in shack dirty.

Shack No. 36.

Norwegian, naturalized. Single, age 49 years. In Alberta 25 years, with exception of a few months in B.C. On relief in 1931, not since.
Living on dump since 1931. Built shack 6x8x7, paper inside, boards and tin outside.
Furnishings - bed and covering, stove, chair, carpenter tools.
Livelihood, making baskets and little wagons and selling junk. Makes about \$20.00 per month.
Sanitary accommodation toilet outside. Gets water from spring. Does own cooking and washing. Inside of shack filthy.

Shack No. 37.

Heave, Finlander, age 50 years, single. Not on relief. In Canada since 1905. Port Arthur and Winnipeg for some time, Alberta for 11 years. Came to Edmonton Nov. 1936 from Sylvan Lake. Bought shack for \$3.00, 10x16-7, living alone.

Livelihood - worked past 4 years with farmer at Sylvan Lake, and is going back there as soon as Springopens up. Earns enough in Summer to keep him during Winter, together with selling some junk.

Gets water at Spring, uses neighbor's toilet. Does own cooking and laundry. Furnishings - 2 apple boxes for chairs, 1 bed and bedding, 1 stove. Conditions dirty.

Came back to City from Relief Camp about 4 weeks ago, not on relief at present, but expects to apply shortly. Bought shack 2 weeks ago, paid \$2.00. 10x8x7. Covered inside with cardboard papers, outside with tin. Furnishings - box for chair, box for table, 1 bed, oil barrel for stove. Gets water from tap. Toilet outside. Place filthy.

Shack No. 42.

Called at this shack several times, and each time found the shack locked. However, there is someone staying during the nights, as we noticed the smoke coming out of the pipe.

In Edmonton from 1911 to 1913. In B.C. from 1913 to 1921. Edmonton 1921 working on Railway in and out of City, until 1927. In Edmonton since. Living in Montgomery Block, Room 2 from 1933 until October 1936, when he purchased one room shack \$10.00 at present location. Living alone. Shack filthy. 10x14x7. Papered inside, boards & tin outside. Means of livelihood - sister in U.S.A. sends money. On single Men's relief one week in October 1936, when he changed his address through misunderstanding at Post Office. No toilet accommodation yet, claims he is making one when frost gets out of ground. Using river water, boiling it. Contents of shack - stove, 2 chairs, bed and covering, table, and cooking utensils. Does cooking and laundry.

Shack No. 44.

C. Now, Swedish, age 57 years, single, in Canada 28 years, in Edmonton since 1918. Evansburg Relief Camp Aug. 1935 until April 1936. Working on railway from April 1936 to August 1936. Single Relief since November 1936, and at present, meals only. Built Shack Fall of 1936, 6x10x7, one room, no windows, lined with cardboard inside, tin outside. Uses neighbor's toilet. Water from spring. Furnishings - single bed & bedding, bench, stove, no rent or taxes. Living alone.

Shack No. 45.

I. Leg, age 31 years, single. Came to Canada, B.C., in 1928. In Edmonton in and out since 1931. Steady in City since October 1936. Was never on relief.

Making artificial butterflies, and selling them, making from \$10.00 to \$25.00 per month. Built the shack in 1934, 12x8x7. Inside covered with cardboard, outside with tin. Furnishings - chair, small bench, tablet bed, oil barrel stove. Getting watter from tap. outside. Does own cooking & laundry. place filthy.
