The City of Edmonton Building Great Neighbourhoods team, will explore the redevelopment of City-owned areas within the community, including green spaces and parks. Building Great Neighbourhoods will look for opportunities and funding to make desired upgrades and enhancements in coordination with the Neighbourhood Renewal program.

- Better connection to the shared-use path on 122 Street
- · Improve Grandview park entrance to make it more inviting
- · Provide amenities to improve use of parks

SCHOOL DROP-OFF

What We Heard – Interests

- Congestion at intersections along 122 Street, 63 Avenue, 62 Avenue and school drop-off area along 127 Street
- Concerns about safety on 127 Street due to speeding and limited visibility
- · Reduce congestion and improve safety for all users

CONNECTIVITY & CORRIDORS

What We Heard – Interests

- Informal foot path along north edge of Grand View Drive and south edge of 62 Avenue supports walking and cross-country skiing but is not accessible for people who have limited mobility (i.e. seniors, people with strollers, persons with disabilities)
- · Better connection to the surrounding green spaces like the River Valley, Whitemud Park, etc. with improved accessibility

PLACEMAKING

What We Heard – Interests

- · Create a space that offers something more to the community like amenities and enhanced planting

What We Heard – Interests

- · Concerns regarding speeding on 125 and 127 Street, as well as the turn from 128 Street to 66 Avenue
- · Visibility and concerns regarding speeding issues at crest of hill on 63 Avenue
- Concerns about using 62 Avenue as park and ride leaving less options for parking
- Missing curb ramps at some intersections
- Better traffic management solutions incorporated within the community to make a safer and more efficient way to get around
