Preparing for Construction

Planning has been underway for Beaumaris's neighbourhood renewal since November 2018. We have been busy reviewing resident feedback, understanding opportunities and constraints from a technical perspective and building on City policies and processes to develop a neighbourhood renewal design.

As we prepare for construction we would like to share the final design with you. The time has come to start construction in Beaumaris!

Starting in spring 2021, Beaumaris will see the replacement of its aging collector and local roadway surfaces, streetlights, sidewalks, and alleys as part of the City of Edmonton's Neighbourhood Renewal program for mature neighbourhoods.

Neighbourhood Renewal also looks at improvements for City-owned areas within the community, including green spaces and parks. Throughout this project, we have identified opportunities to make desired upgrades and enhancements in coordination with the Neighbourhood Renewal program.







Update on parking restrictions

At a previous public event, parking restrictions were proposed on local roads to allow for new sidewalks. We heard concerns that parking restrictions could cause a shortage in parking. Based on this feedback, we removed the parking restrictions in most areas and maintained most of the new sidewalks.







Beaumaris Park to Beaumaris Lake

Final design location



What is included in the design...

- + new raised crosswalks
- + new curb extensions and boulevard areas
- + a reconstructed shared-use path to enhance connections
- + new boulevard and tree planting to improve the look and feel of the street

Changes from the refined designs...

- + the removal of the decorative crosswalk on 106 Street
- + maintaining the existing concrete pathway connection in Beaumaris park

*Please note that amenities such as lighting, seating and waste receptacles are being considered near the lake through the Beaumaris Lake Rehabilitation Project.





What is included in the design...

- + new raised crosswalks
- + new curb extensions and planting areas
- + new wider sidewalks on both sides of the street
- + new wider grassy boulevard area and tree planting to improve the look and feel of the street

Changes from the refined designs...

+ the decorative crosswalk near 158 Avenue to support the commercial hub as a destination is still being considered

Results of decorative street lighting expression of interest

Decorative street lighting


The community proposed a decorative street light option to the City in August 2020. **417** property owners responded to the Expression of Interest. A majority of property owners who responded were not supportive of a decorative street light upgrade. As a result, the decorative street light upgrade will not move forward and Neighbourhood Renewal will include the installation of standard galvanized streetlights matching the new streetlights in Lorelei.

Construction staging map

Beaumaris Neighbourhood Renewal will begin in 2021. It is expected to take three years to complete. Construction is staged and different segments of the neighbourhood will see construction at different times over the next three years. The staging map is the anticipated breakdown on when the three sections of Beaumaris will be renewed.
