Measure	Benefits and Trade-offs	
	<ul> <li>People who bike have their own space, separating them from people who drive and walk</li> <li>Bike lanes are snow cleared to bare pavement within 24 hours of the end of a snowfall event</li> </ul>	
Protected Bike Lanes	May result in loss of parking on one side or both sides of the street depending on width of street	
	May result in loss of two-way traffic direction	
	May result in possible reduction of travel lanes	
Shared-use Path	<ul> <li>People who bike can use the path in both directions</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Snow cleared to bare pavement two-way within 48 hours of the end of a snowfall event</li> </ul>	
	Typically does not result in major changes to the operation of the road	
	+ People who walk and people who bike share the same space which can be a concern in high conflict areas	
	May result in potential reduction of lane widths or number of travel lanes

Measure	Benefits and Trade-offs	Example
Shared road bike lane with traffic calming	<ul> <li>On-street parking on both sides of the road is maintained</li> <li>Two-way traffic is maintained</li> <li>People who walk and people who bike are separated</li> <li>Landscaping within the City right-of-way is not impacted</li> <li>People who bike and people who drive share the road by travelling in single file</li> <li>Shared residential roadways are bladed to a level snowpack and typically started within 48 hours after a snowfall event ends and completed within 7 days</li> <li>Traffic calming measures will likely impact design at intersections to slow motor vehicles speeds</li> <li>Painted markings may be difficult to distinguish when covered by snow in the winter</li> </ul>
