

Neighbourhood and Alley Renewal is coming to Hairsine!

Through the Building Great Neighbourhoods Branch, the Neighbourhood and Alley Renewal Program rehabilitates residential roads, replaces street lights, repairs sidewalks and, where possible, connects missing sidewalk links. Alley Renewal will also be included as part of this project and involves alley reconstruction and repaving, improvements to surface drainage where possible and upgrading existing lighting to LED fixtures. Other opportunities to improve parks and public spaces will also be explored. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2024.


Road Map to **Building Great Neighbourhoods**



How decisions are made

For Neighbourhood Renewal projects, the City of Edmonton makes decisions using a combination of policy and program information, public input, technical requirements and available funding. This process helps to ensure that the decisions we make are fiscally responsible, align with best practices, consider the existing public and private infrastructure, land uses and activities in the neighbourhood, and result in the best outcomes for your neighbourhood and our city.

City policies and programs such as the Complete Streets Design and Construction Standards, Safe Mobility Strategy and Winter City Strategy provide the overall direction for Neighbourhood Renewal designs. As each neighbourhood is unique, the project team asks for input from residents who live, work and play in the neighbourhood and considers technical aspects such as roadway widths and conflicts with utilities and trees to determine what will fit in the neighbourhood.



Starting the Conversation

In November 2021, we met with the Community League Board of Directors and held a virtual meeting with organizations and business owners in the area to share project information, as well as to ask for their input on ways to best involve and engage the community.

Visioning and Exploring Opportunities

From January to March 2022, the project team invites you to help **CREATE** the **Vision and Guiding Principles** for the Hairsine Neighbourhood Renewal project. Through various engagement opportunities, you will be able to share your ideas and explore potential opportunities for your community.

This committee is not involved with decision making, or influencing the neighbourhood design; it is focused on ensuring effective public engagement and communications.
