How the final designs were selected

Several factors were considered in the selection of the final designs, including what we heard from the community at four previous engagement events and surveys, City policies and programs, technical requirements, and funding.

These designs are based on the vision, core values, community options, and draft concepts that were developed and influenced based on what we heard at these events. Vision and Core Values

The final designs were informed by the vision statement and core values, which were developed based on input from community members at previous engagement events.

Vision Statement

Between 40 Avenue and 43 Avenue

What is Being Improved:

- Widened sidewalks along the west side of 114 Street to promote higher walking volumes and links to key destinations
- · Shared roadway with a speed limit of 30 km/hr to improve existing bike route
- A new raised crosswalk across 114 Street near 41 Avenue to slow traffic and improve safety
- Signalization of the intersection to increase pedestrian safety and orderly movement of traffic



Between 43 Avenue and 44A Avenue





What is Being Improved:

 A new shared use path along the east side of the street as a dedicated space for people to walk and bike

Changes from Preliminary Design (November 8):

Addition of coloured concrete within the shared use path
 Renewal of pathway leading up to the bridge



Between 40 Avenue and 41 Avenue





What is Being Improved:

· Widened sidewalk on both sides of the street

 Curb extensions at mid-block crosswalk to reduce the walking distance when crossing and improve sight lines

· Flashing lights at crosswalks near the school and community league

Changes from Preliminary Design (November 8):

- Removed landscaping from mid-block curb extension to maximize visibility of people crossing the road and increase walking surface
- Removed curb extension with landscaping at 40 Avenue and 117 Street intersection to allow turning movements for large vehicles such as buses and to help reduce wait time for left and right turns onto 40 Avenue
- New zebra marked crosswalk at 41 Avenue and 116 Street to increase driver awareness for people crossing the road, based on the public feedback

Note:

Feedback from previous events has been shared with Edmonton Public Schools for future planning considerations. Options to improve drop–off and pick–up operations are being reviewed.

What is Being Improved:

 117 Street bike route improvements are being constructed with neighbourhood renewal as part of the final approved design for the 43 Ave shared use path project



Royal Gardens Park Improvements

What is Being Improved:

- Improve lighting around key activity nodes
- Additional seating to improve accessibility and enjoyment of the space
 Additional trees and waste receptacles to help beautify the park

Changes from Preliminary Design (November 8):

Additional light added closer to the sledding hill based on public feedback
 Additional trees added based on public feedback



· Water fountain removed due to infrastructure constraints





What is Being Improved:

- · Additional seating areas with a concrete pad, waste receptacles and shrub beds
- · West extension to shared use path and connections to existing shared use path and walkways
- Coniferous and deciduous trees and new planting beds
- The addition of a picnic table
- · A space for potential future public art
- Installation of new 1.2m sidewalk on north side of 43 Avenue (between 115 and 116 Street) to improve accessibility and walkability

Changes from Preliminary Design (November 8):

- · Western end of new trail orientation adjusted based on public feedback and utility considerations · Seating in northwest corner moved to more visible location based on public feedback
- Dog bag dispenser added based on public feedback
- · Landscaping, boulders and bollards added to deter illegal vehicle crossing based on public feedback

What is Being Improved:

- · Additional seating areas with a concrete pad, waste receptacles and shrub beds
- New flashing lights for crosswalks near the schools
- Coniferous and deciduous trees and new planting beds
- · A space for potential future public art
- Installation of flashing beacons to increase visibility of those crossing the street and driver awareness
- · Removal and replacements of connector sidewalks to provide better connections and walking experiences.

Changes from Preliminary Design (November 8):

- Dog bag dispenser added based on public feedback
- · Landscaping, boulders and bollards added to deter illegal vehicle crossing based on public feedback
