PARENTS ARE PART OF THE SOLUTION

While most young people do not join street gangs, there are some common warning signs that parents need to recognize to help their children avoid interest in or involvement with gangs. Know what your children are doing, watch for changes in behavior and attitude, and help them protect themselves. If your child has changed his or her habits, attitude toward family, friends and school, or is suddenly secretive about aspects of his or her life, you may have reason to be concerned.

Some things to watch for:

- stays out late without a good reason
- has an unusual interest in special clothing styles, colors, logos
- has a special interest in gangster influenced music, videos, movies or web sites.
- has unexplained injuries, such as black eyes, injuries to hands/knuckles
- has unexplained money or goods, such as jewelry or a cell phone
- is secretive about new friends
- uses 'gang slang'
- suddenly changes friends and withdraws from the family
- has sudden mood changes, is harder to handle, is more resentful
- skips school, has lower grades, no longer does homework

BE PART OF THE SOLUTION

Support your children. Do things together you both enjoy.

Open communication. Talk to your children about the dangers of alcohol, drugs and gangs.

Listen to your children. Let them know they can talk to you about anything.

Understand that you, as a role model, must set a good example.

Teach your children to think for themselves and act in a responsible way.

Involve your children in positive after school activities.

Offer to help and support your children, no matter what the problem.

Never feel you're alone. Ask advice from family, friends, teachers and neighbours.
