## Covid-19 Context

The Covid-19 pandemic has impacted our neighbourhoods and communities across Edmonton and the world. For this project, the public health restrictions significantly impacted the engagement process to collect neighbourhood ideas and feedback. We had to work creatively with the community to seek input through the workbook.

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# 1. Neighbourhood Revitalization Program and the Capital Investment Process

The City of Edmonton's Neighbourhood Revitalization Program uses an asset and place-based community development model to identify initiatives and clarify priorities held by community members as it relates to enhancing their neighbourhood. The goal of the Neighbourhood Revitalization Program is to improve the livability of Edmonton's mature and established neighbourhoods, and mobilize community-led action. The program offers resources to support both social and physical infrastructure.

Resources to support the physical infrastructure development in Inglewood falls under the Neighbourhood Revitalization Capital Investment Plan. Capital investments may include replacing old for new infrastructure. Some examples are enhanced lighting, benches, public art, wayfinding features and park redevelopment. Investments in physical infrastructure enhance public spaces such as roadways, alleys, open spaces, and parks, to increase social connection, beautification, economic vibrancy and safety.

Neighbourhood Revitalization Capital Investment follows the City of Edmonton's Project Develop and Delivery Model (PDDM). As projects go through the strategy, concept, design, build, operation and delivery phases, the PDDM establishes set checkpoints. It is intended to ensure that all City projects have completed necessary checkpoints before being considered for the delivery phase.



# 2. What We Heard in Inglewood

## WHO WE HEARD FROM



Residents, businesses, non profit and other stakeholders of the Inglewood neighbourhood had the opportunity to contribute specific ideas for capital investment in a workbook in October 2020. The workbook was distributed online and made available in print as an opportunity to collect information about public spaces for physical improvements within the neighbourhood. The workbook encouraged people to think about physical improvements as they relate to the vision and goals of Inglewood's Revitalization Strategy.

The information gathered can be found in this What We Heard Report and will assist the Inglewood Revitalization Capital Team to make recommendations to the City regarding investment priorities in the Inglewood neighbourhood.

## WHAT YOU TOLD US

In the workbook we heard many suggestions for improving physical infrastructure in Inglewood and we also heard about the strengths that already exist in Inglewood. Some of the strengths that can be built upon include the spaces where people naturally seem to connect in ways that support vibrancy and inclusive activity including: parks, green spaces, and playgrounds; restaurants, cafes and shops along 124 Street and 118 Avenue; and the 127 Street bike lane for different modes of active transportation.

Some of the areas for improvement that we heard include adding and enhancing amenities such as lighting and seating, enhancing art, history and wayfinding, and maintaining and enhancing trees and green space throughout the neighbourhood.

We also heard concerns expressed around road and alley surfaces, traffic calming, and crime and vacant properties.

Detailed feedback from the Inglewood neighbourhood is organized on the following pages by theme. The community goals connected to each idea are identified.

While all feedback is reviewed and considered. not all ideas will be approved and developed into a project. Recommendations will be made through a formal prioritization process with the community capital project team and will take into consideration available budget, community desire, and other criteria developed during the prioritization process.



# COORDINATING CAPITAL INVESTMENT WITH OTHER KEY PROJECTS IN THE AREA

The Inglewood Revitalization Strategy notes that community members desire to use Revitalization capital funding strategically, to maximize the impact of Neighbourhood Renewal activities in Inglewood. Related information gathered through the Revitalization Program's capital investment public engagement process will be shared with The 124 Street Arterial Renewal and Building Great Neighbourhoods Inglewood Neighbourhood Renewal projects and they will coordinate with Revitalization to see if any additional elements of the infrastructure recommendations can be included in the work.

## 124TH STREET ARTERIAL RENEWAL

Planning and design is underway for renewing 124 Street! 111 Avenue – 118 Avenue will be renewed including road reconstruction, replacement of street lights, curb and gutters and repairing sidewalks. 109 Avenue to 111 Avenue will also be repaved as a part of this project. Other opportunities to improve connections and public spaces for year-round use are also being explored. The next public engagement opportunity to provide feedback on the final design for 124 Street Renewal will be in March 2021.

#### BUILDING GREAT NEIGHBOURHOODS INGLEWOOD NEIGHBOURHOOD RENEWAL

Inglewood is currently undergoing Neighbourhood Renewal which is expected to be completed in 2021. Neighbourhood reconstruction involves road reconstruction and repaving, as well as replacement of streetlights and reconstruction of sidewalks, curb and gutter. The final neighbourhood designs were developed based on the feedback received throughout the public engagement process, and also considered City policies, programs, and technical considerations. The final neighbourhood designs include:

- Upgraded residential streets, including measures to slow traffic
- Improved connections for people who walk and bike
- Enhanced park and green spaces

The Dogs Off Leash program has joined renewal efforts to adapt the Linear Park design. Public engagement with an updated draft design occurred in the fall of 2020. The final design will be available to see at public engagement events for the 124 Street Renewal project in March of 2021.
