

## Scheduled Intake Saves More Lives

Scheduled Intake Model	Overcrowded and Unmanaged
Freedom From Discomfort – Food and sleeping areas separate from the litter area gives cats more room.	More Illness – Illness limits our ability to care for animals efficiently.
<b>Healthier Cats</b> – Fewer cats staying in the shelter reduces each cat's exposure to illness and disease.	More Stress – Increase in stress-induced illnesses.
<b>Reduced Stress –</b> More space, fewer cats = ability to express normal behaviour.	Inhumane – Cats living in a single kennel are forced to eat and sleep in the same area as their litter box.
More Enrichment – More enrichment such as visits to our new outdoor Cat Catio!	<b>Backup Effect</b> – When ACCC is overcrowded, chances are adoption agencies and rescues are as well.
<b>More Adoptions</b> – Healthier, happier and enriched cats lead to faster adoptions.	<b>Less Enrichment –</b> More cats mean staff spend more time cleaning and feeding and have less time to provide enrichment.
Increased Cat Turnover – Transfers out to adoption agencies or rescues mean more room to take in other cats who need care.	Fewer Transfers – Cats that are unhealthy, unhappy and stressed due to overcrowding conditions are less likely to be transferred out for adoption.
<b>Better Prioritization –</b> Priority given to cats with immediate health issues or injuries.	<b>Less Caregiver Time</b> – Too many cats at one time limits capacity to care for cats currently in care.

**More Caregiver Time –** Staff are better equipped to care for cats in care when not overwhelmed.
