

The City of Edmonton's vision is for Edmontonians to live in more transitoriented communities with improved access to their places of work, schools, hospitals and local destinations.

The Metro Line NW LRT is part of the City's Transportation Master Plan vision. Expanding the existing line that currently stops at NAIT Station will improve mobility and access to existing and new neighbourhoods in the north and northwest sections of the City, and including the City of St. Albert.

The Metro Line NW LRT expansion will extend from a new station at NAIT north through Blatchford to connect to key activity centres along 113A Street and then west along 153 Avenue to Campbell Road. The expansion will contribute to reduced travel times for those using LRT, particularly as the City continues to grow and vehicle congestion continues to increase. It will provide Edmontonians and St. Albert residents with a sustainable, efficient and reliable mobility choice, connecting people to key destinations in the City, such as NAIT, Royal Alexandra Hospital, services and shopping areas, and the City centre, as well as getting people back to their families at the end of a long day.

Planning for the Metro Line NW LRT expansion includes a comprehensive community engagement program. This program is fully integrated into the planning process for concept validation and preliminary engineering.

Metro Line Northwest LRT Stages

The Metro Line NW LRT expansion will occur in two stages: Stage 1 – NAIT to Blatchford, and Stage 2 – Blatchford to Campbell Road. The NAIT to Blatchford phase is a top priority for the City and will be construction-procurement ready by 2018.

WHAT IS URBAN STYLE LRT?

Urban Style LRT is a change in approach from Edmonton's current suburban system. The urban style improves connections between the LRT and city life. It integrates with the communities it serves and fosters transit use through the following features:

- Smaller scale stations spaced closer together to attract ridership
- Direct transit, pedestrian and cyclist connections
- Reduced operating speeds in neighbourhoods to ensure safety and minimize potential impacts
- Landscaping, streetscaping and architectural features to improve visual appeal
- Improved accessibility with minimal barriers (e.g., gates, fencing) and strong connections to community destinations
