




## Project Overview & Status Update



# LRT Network ETS








- New style of LRT for Edmonton urban, low floor trains
- Stage 1 (Between downtown & Mill Woods) to be delivered as a P3

















- Currently in procurement stage
- Three teams on short list preparing bids
- To complete design, build, operate, maintain, and partially finance the Valley Line
  - Trans Ed Partners
  - Moving YEG
  - River City Transit
- Bids to be submitted later this year
- Contract to be awarded by early 2016
- Construction to begin in 2016 with completion in 2020

# Looking Ahead 2016-2020

LRT Construction is expected to begin in 2016 and continue through 2020, with 102 Avenue closed for most of that time.

Details of construction staging, including planned schedule, should be available by early spring 2016.



#### **THE WORK**

- P3 Contractor takes over the site
- Total Closure
- Alternating Closures
- Churchill Vertical Connection and Traction Power Substation
- What it entails:
  - Relocation of utilities
  - Building LRT infrastructure

#### **POTENTIAL IMPACTS**

- Demolition, excavation, construction and restoration.
- Closure of a portion of Churchill Square and 99 Street for 19 months from October 1, 2016 to April 30, 2018 or October 1, 2017 to April 30, 2019

- Impacts inevitable
- Closures of 102 Ave crossings to be alternating

## Membership

- Volunteers to reflect community cross-section
- Group to function until Valley Line begins service
- Membership/composition reviewed annually
- Ideally, members should live or work in the zone



# Citizen Working Groups - Guidelines ETS

## **Conduct of Meetings**

- Facilitated by Community Relations Advisor
  - Role includes being community advocate on project team
- Regular & timely sharing of information
- Identify issues, opportunities & concerns
- No decision-making
- Alignment, concept, preliminary design &
   P3 procurement not up for debate
  - City will not re-visit past decisions



# Citizen Working Groups - Guidelines ETS

### Conduct of Meetings (cont'd)

- Through dialogue with group, City will:
  - promote engagement opportunities;
  - seek opportunities to minimize and mitigate impacts related to detailed design and construction; and
  - build and maintain relationships and trust.
- Members to understand/share local knowledge & interests
- Mutual respect & trust
- Support overall best interests of community
- Treat participation as a commitment
- Except for City staff & Councillors who may be present, nonmembers attend only by mutual agreement of group

# Citizen Working Groups - Guidelines ETS

### Scheduling, agendas, facilities etc.

- Meeting frequency, times, duration flexible; determined by group
- Topics identified in advance
- Minutes within 2 weeks after meetings
- Agendas & minutes posted on website
- City to arrange / provide / pay for facilities

East of 104 Street, South of 106
 Avenue, north/west of north valley
 edge (McDougall Hill/Grierson
 Hill/Jasper Avenue)





# Citizen Working Groups – Zone Details ETS

#### **Group A – Downtown**

- 2 representatives assigned by the Downtown Community League
- 2 representatives assigned by the Boyle Street Community League
- 2 solicited from the community at large
- 1 assigned by the Downtown Edmonton Business Association
- 1 assigned by the Edmonton Chamber of Commerce
- 1 from Edmonton City Centre
- 1 representing Festivals (Churchill Square)
- 1 representing Arts District
- 1 representing Chinese Benevolent Association
- 1 representing local schools, in consultation with school boards





### Suggested peer selection process

- Positions available: 2, plus up to 3 "reserve list" slots
- Start by identifying volunteers
- If volunteers exceed available positions, each candidate makes case to full group
- Full group votes for 1 person each by ballot;
   positions / reserve slots awarded in order of votes received
