

- New style of LRT for Edmonton urban, low floor trains
- Stage 1 (Between downtown & Mill Woods) to be delivered as a P3

- Currently in procurement stage
- Three teams on short list preparing bids to complete design, build, operate, maintain, and partially finance the Valley Line
 - Trans Ed Partners
 - Moving YEG
 - River City Transit
- Bids to be submitted later this year
- Contract to be awarded by early 2016
- Construction to begin in 2016 with completion in 2020



85/83 Corridor Update

Preparing for LRT Construction:

- Some relocation of underground utilities
 - (e.g. Telus @83 St at 81, 78 & 76 Ave.)
- Removal of buildings on purchased properties (81 Ave; 78 Ave)
- Some access closures (e.g. direct accesses to 83 Street)
 - Going to public hearing at City Council June 17
- Additional access closures this fall




Citizen Working Groups - Purpose

- Build and maintain relationships and trust
- Promote and support community engagement opportunities
- Facilitate information-sharing and dialogue
- Support the identification of issues, opportunities and concerns
- Seek opportunities to minimize and mitigate impacts related to detailed design and construction
- Supplement to other methods of engagement



Citizen Working Groups – 5 Zone:







Membership

- Volunteers to reflect community cross-section
- Group to function until Valley Line begins service
- Membership/composition reviewed annually
- Ideally, members should live or work in the zone





Conduct of Meetings

- Facilitated by Community Relations Advisor
- Regular & timely sharing of information
- Identify issues, opportunities & concerns
- No decision-making
- Alignment, concept, preliminary design & P3 procurement not up for debate
 - City will not re-visit past decisions



Citizen Working Groups - Guidelines

Conduct of Meetings (cont'd)

- Through dialogue with group, City will:
 - promote engagement opportunities;
 - seek opportunities to minimize and mitigate impacts related to detailed design and construction; and
 - build and maintain relationships and trust.
- Members to understand/share local knowledge & interests
- Mutual respect & trust
- Support overall best interests of community
- Treat participation as a commitment
- Except for City staff & Councillors who may be present, nonmembers attend only by mutual agreement of group



Citizen Working Groups - Guidelines


Scheduling, agendas, facilities etc.

- Meeting frequency, times, duration flexible; determined by group
- Topics identified in advance
- Minutes within 2 weeks after meetings
- Agendas & minutes posted on website
- City to arrange / provide / pay for facilities



Group D – Whitemud


- East of 91 Street, south of 76 Avenue, west of 67 Street, north of Whitemud Drive.
- Some discussion of merging residential area north of Argyll Rd. with Group C to the north.
- Selection of "at-large" members should occur first.





Group D – Whitemud


- 2 representatives assigned by Avonmore Community League
- 2 representatives assigned by Argyll Community League
- 2 solicited from the community at large
- 2 assigned by the South Edmonton Business Association, including possible representative from trucking/high load industry
- 1-2 representing local schools, in consultation with school boards





Group C – 85/83 Street Corridor

• Generally east of 92 Street, south of 93 Avenue, west of 75 Street, north of 76 Avenue.



Group C – 85/83 Street Corridor

- 2 representatives assigned by Bonnie Doon Community League
- 2 representatives assigned by Idylwylde Community League
- 2 assigned by King Edward Park Community League
- 2 solicited from the community at large
- 2 assigned by the French Quarter BRZ
- 1 from the Bonnie Doon Shopping Centre
- 1 from the French-Canadian Association of Alberta
- 1 from local seniors community, in consultation with Edmonton Seniors Coordinating Council
- 1-2 representing local schools, in consultation with school boards









Suggested peer selection process

- Positions available: 2, plus up to 3 "reserve list" slots
- Start by identifying volunteers
- If volunteers exceed available positions:
 - Option 1: break out into sub-groups for "primaries", each to produce 1 candidate; resulting candidates make case to full group
 - Option 2: all candidates make case to full group
- Full group votes for 1 person each by ballot; positions / reserve slots awarded in order of votes received
