### Building Great Neighbourhoods Royal Gardens

### May 2018

#### **Project Overview**

Starting in 2019, Royal Gardens will see the replacement of its aging collector and local roadway surfaces, street lights, and sidewalks as part of the City of Edmonton's Neighbourhood Renewal program for mature neighbourhoods. Planning for this renewal has begun. A new dedicated City branch, Building Great Neighbourhoods, will explore improvements to other City-owned areas within the neighbourhood, including green spaces and parks, and look for opportunities and funding to make desired upgrades and enhancements in coordination with the Neighbourhood Renewal program. The reconstruction in Royal Gardens is expected to be completed in 2020.

#### Where We Are Today

As a follow-up to the Community Walk and Ideas Workshop held on February 24, the aim of the Vision Confirmation and Community Options public event, taking place on May 15, is to provide the community with the opportunity to share feedback on the vision, core values, and potential design options for infrastructure in Royal Gardens. A survey will also be available after the event to collect the same input.
