

Edmonton Elections

The non-partisan entity within the Office of the City Clerk that plans and executes the Edmonton Election on behalf of:

- City of Edmonton
- Edmonton School Division
- Edmonton Catholic Separate School Division







Campaign Basics

Can't

 No City of Edmonton or Edmonton Election branding.

Can

 Place signage on private property with the permission of owner.





Where you can't campaign

City Hall and City Facilities:

- Any facility booked/maintained by the City
- Recreation centres, sports fields, parkland and open spaces

Schools:

 EPSB and ECSD prohibit campaigning on school grounds or at school events

Voting Opportunities: Any voting station

 No canvassing for votes; displaying signage; wearing campaign materials





Election Signage

Candidate is responsible for sign placement

Private property: During campaign period

Must have permission from the property owner

On road right-of-way: September 8 to October 23.

- Near any way (public or private) that is usually allowed for driving or parking
- Signs can go on grassed boulevards of roads, alleys, sidewalks and bridges





Where can't a sign go?

- On medians, traffic islands, or in traffic circles.
- Within 15 metres from an intersection.
- Within 2 metres of the face of a curb.
- Within 30 metres of a transit station.
- On highway structures
 - bridges, guardrails, or retaining walls
- On or in a transit vehicle or transit station property
- Not allowed in parks

Election Signage

Sign size and spacing:

- Maximum sign face: 0.6 m wide x 1 m high.
 - 1 metre from ground surface to top of the sign
- Spacing: Signs from the same candidate must be at least 20 metres apart.

Placing a sign:

- Must be staked firmly and securely
- Can't be electrified or inflatable
- Cannot be derelict, damaged, or unsightly.





Consequences for Violations:

- Signs may be removed by community standards
- Fines at the discretion of officers
 - \$250.00 standard fine
 - \$500.00 violations resembling traffic control devices, safety hazards, or damage to public property
- Removed signs can be picked up by appointment at the Sign Seizure Lot





Multi-Unit Dwellings

- Apartment and Condo Buildings; Mobile Home Parks
- Campaigning activities may occur in common areas, where permitted
- Candidates are not entitled to enter private or secure areas of a multi-unit building or enter individual suites.
- Candidates should connect with property managers prior to embarking on campaign activities
- Residents can ask anyone campaigning for proper documentation





Multi-Unit Dwellings: Forms

To campaign in apartment or condo buildings:

Forms must not be altered or digitally displayed

Form 11

For candidates and official agents

- Must be submitted and approved by Edmonton Elections
- Must be carried at all times and presented upon request

Form 12

For campaign workers

- Must be signed by the candidate
- Must be carried during campaigning
- Does not need to be submitted to Edmonton Elections
